

# September 20, 2020 TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

## FROM OUR PASTOR

September 20th is marked as Catechetical Sunday in the United States. We will be offering a blessing for all who are teachers of the faith in our school and religious education program at all of the Masses. Nonetheless, all of us who are baptized are to teach by the way we live our daily lives with joy and charity. Catechists often focus on the facts of faith/information that will build a foundation for the students to add to over the course of their lives. Parents and godparents are to be that immediate witness and teacher by example. Then we as that parish community of faith are to support in prayer and our own witness the budding faith of our young people. The facts of faith seem contradicted by so many things in society that we need solid catechists to aid them in growing in the faith. Please pray this year for those volunteers who have stepped forth to be catechists for our parish religious education program and at our school.

Next weekend will feature Fr. Nathan for our annual mission appeal. This summer was not a good time for that to happen so as a diocese we have moved it into the Fall. Fr. Nathan works in our diocese as a pastor of parishes. He comes to us for an appeal for the work of his Capuchin Order. His order runs schools in India and around the world providing education to children who are not just marginalized but even considered "untouchable" and worthy of care. On the other end of the spectrum they offer health care to those who truly are left in the streets. In India the Exchange rate is about 73 to every dollar, so your support goes a long way. Their Order also serves parishes around the world. So as we consider how difficult things have been here, I encourage your support for their efforts in parts of the world that suffer in ways that we can take for granted. Please take the time to welcome Fr. Nathan and pray for his Order.

As we are getting closer to the lifting of the dispensation of the obligation of attending Sunday Mass in the diocese of La Crosse (more on that next week) I offer thoughts from "That Man Is You" reflection on the Holy Eucharist. "God allowed Blessed Charles de Foucauld, a great missionary and mystic of the 20th century, to have a glimpse of this blessed life: 'Jesus came to Nazareth, the place of the hidden life, of ordinary life, of family life, of prayer, work, obscurity silent virtues, practiced with no witnesses other than God, his friends and neighbors. (Carles de Foucauld, Essential Writings, p. 28).

Indeed, Blessed Charles came to understand the presence of Christ at Nazareth in a manner not unlike the presence of Christ in the Eucharist. At Nazareth, Christ did not 'look like God'--no miracles, no profound teachings, no denunciation of errors, no righting of wrongs. Christ was present in a hidden way drawing people to himself by His example of self-forgetful love.

This is truly an image of Christ in the Eucharist. He is hidden, but present. Silently loving and offering himself. When we receive the gift of Christ in the Eucharist, Christ establishes his home--a type of little Nazareth in our hearts: 'If a man loves me, he will keep my word...and we will come to him and make our home with him' (John 14:23).

In the coming weeks as we come home to church, our parish community and family, may we make a home for Jesus, building that home through graces received in the Holy Eucharist.

The last weekend of September, a mission appeal will be taken for **Franciscan Capuchin, Mary Queen of the Peace province, Tamil Nadu, India.** Rev. Irudaya Nathan Thainese (Father Nathan) the pastor of St. Anthony De Padua, Cazenovia WI will preach in all three Masses and do the appeal.

The Capuchins are working in 106 countries in the world. They are officially named as a mendicant. In Mary Queen of the Peace Province, the capuchins have involved lots of ministers. The priests work as pastors while taking care of the spiritual needs of the laity in 12 parishes in Tamil Nadu, India, 7 parishes in Zimbabwe (Africa) and 3 parishes in Sri Lanka. Some priests are involved in counselling psychology, they offer various skills to people in times of conflicts both in their personal life and in their family life. The Capuchins are involved in the education of the economically poor of our mission places. There are 300 hundred boys and girls studying in our 3 children homes right now. They are with us for 10 months in a year and for their vacation they go to their homes. These children are from economically poor families and through our children homes rural boys and girls are given opportunity to get educated and look for skills development in pursuit of their future.

During this pandemic (Covid-19) while taking care of our health and safety we reached out to hundreds of families with dry rations, supply of medicine, alleviating their sufferings through traumatic counselling by TV programs and radio messages, we too took care of the terminally ill viz HIV patients, victims of Covid-19 (through sanitation, awareness programs, supplying of nutrition food and herbal, ayervedic drinks etc).

So friends, I request you to support our ministers. Thanking you in advance for your greater help that you are extending towards our missions in India and other countries. May God bless you all.
