FROM OUR PASTOR:

You know that when people talk about the news, it is not usually good. We wait to hear what tragedy occurred or who was hurt. But we have Good News. We have the Gospel. Is that a part of our conversations? Where does the Lord fit into the daily goings on? It can all seem a bit dark at times when we look and do not find the light at the end of the tunnel.

This past week I received two different phone calls and a text. My cousin, just older than I, died of cancer after a very long fight. A friend's mom has been fighting cancer for a number of years off and on. She has been sent home so as not to die in the hospital. Then I got a call about another friend's dad who was given a few more days to live. We turn to the Holy Spirit, the Lord the Giver of Life, as we pray every Sunday in the Creed.

We just celebrated last week the feasts of the Holy Cross and Our Lady of Sorrows. It seems timely. Jesus knows trials and Mary knows loss and suffering.

We have only to think about so many families here who are still working out what to do after the flooding. Things to throw out. How to replace that which is irreplaceable. We consider too all those impacted by Hurricane Florence. So many who were evacuated and all without electricity. The Church continues to weather the man-made storm of scandals. I offer a few scripture passages for you to pray with and for our shepherds who struggle to find a way forward.

Mark 14:50 they all left Him and fled in the garden of Gethsemane.

Romans 3:3-4 will their infidelity nullify the fidelity of God? No!

Matthew 13:24-30 parable of the weeds among the wheat

Matthew 13:47-48 parable of net that collects good and bad.

Another answer to our dark times are the saints themselves, something we are all called to be. Sts. Andrew Kim Tae-gon and Paul Chong Ha-sang were martyred for the faith. Arrested as priests, the first ordained for their country, they were to be an example to frighten the people away from Jesus. Instead they brought and continue to bring many to the faith in Korea.

- St. Robert Bellarmine was a great teacher of the faith. He was known for his preaching that laid out the faith without confusion in a time of confusion. His writings were used for centuries in forming priests and preparing them for ministry in hostile areas.
- St. Vincent de Paul's feast day is coming up on the 27 of this month. He is a great witness of care and concern for the Body of Christ. He knew that we can help the Body of Christ by helping those most in need. If one suffers, we all suffer as part of the one Body, the Church. We cannot forget that we are connected and what we do helps or harms the Body of Christ. Our actions of charity are of great importance and should not be overlooked because perhaps we think our actions don't add up to much. Also we should consider our attitudes and words that may not always build up the body of Christ, the Church and our neighbors.

News is always around us. There is much going on. Nonetheless may we share and spread the Good News the world needs to hear; that light may shine in hearts overwhelmed by the darkness that seems to be growing. The Day has overcome the night. Let the light shine!!
