

September 27, 2020 TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FROM OUR PASTOR

As I mentioned last week we are looking forward to welcoming Fr. Nathan as part of the mission co-op in our diocese. I ask for your generous response and prayers for the Capuchin Order and all of their efforts around the world to build the kingdom of God.

Also mentioned was the returning of the obligation to attend Mass. Perhaps you saw some news about the dioceses around the state and their plans. We have received a note from Bishop Callahan and I want to share parts of it with you.

"I have decided to NOT re-impose the obligation to attend Mass throughout the Diocese at this time...while this is a departure from the decision of my brother bishops in Wisconsin,...I am considering the high number of new COVID cases in our area and the growing number of congregants, and the ability we have of safely social-distancing in our churches. These factors create a large number of situations that bring us back to the very reason why we lifted the obligation in the first place.

We will monitor the number of COVID cases in the Diocese, the progress towards a vaccine and the amount of people returning to the celebration of the Mass. Know that while the obligation remains dispensed the commandment to keep holy the Sabbath remains, if you are unable to attend Mass or join one of the live stream Masses then please keep the day holy through reading of Scripture, recitation of the Rosary and other spiritual activities. Please continue to follow the instructions for the return to Mass as earlier issued, use common sense, and continue to pray for one another as we make our way through this."

I would like to encourage you to keep in your prayers our bishops and state leaders. I can not imagine what it is like to be in their shoes at this time. So pray for wisdom and compassion.

From our Sacred Worship committee meeting they wanted me to remind everyone and invite you to First Saturday Masses. They are at 8 am. Following Mass, confession will be offered until all are heard. So if you are busy in the afternoon, try coming in the morning for confession. To help us understand what the First Saturday devotion is and what is asked of those trying to fulfill Our Lady's request:

Our Lady explained those Five First Saturdays to Sr. Lucia dos Santos, one of the Fatima visionaries, on Dec. 10, 1925, in the following way:

See, my daughter, my Heart encircled by thorns with which ungrateful men pierce it at every moment by their blasphemies and ingratitude. Do you, at least, strive to console me. Tell them that I promise to assist at the hour of death with the graces necessary for salvation all those who, in order to make reparation to me, on the First Saturday of five successive months, go to Confession, receive Holy Communion, say five decades of the Rosary, and keep me company for a quarter of an hour, meditating on the ... mysteries of the Rosary.

Knowing that the Immaculate Conception is our patronal feast day, turn to her, opening yourself to God's grace in these challenging times.

Missionary Cooperative 2020

This weekend, a mission appeal will be taken for Franciscan

Capuchin, Mary Queen of the Peace province, Tamil Nadu, India. Rev. Irudaya Nathan Thainese (Father Nathan) the pastor of St. Anthony De Padua, Cazenovia WI will preach in all three Masses and do the appeal.

The Capuchins are working in 106 countries in the world. They are officially named as a mendicant. In Mary Queen of the Peace Province, the capuchins have involved lots of ministers. The priests work as pastors while taking care of the spiritual needs of the laity in 12 parishes in Tamil Nadu, India, 7 parishes in Zimbabwe (Africa) and 3 parishes in Sri Lanka. Some priests are involved in counselling psychology, they offer various skills to people in times of conflicts both in their personal life and in their family life. The Capuchins are involved in the education of the economically poor of our mission places. There are 300 hundred boys and girls studying in our 3 children homes right now. They are with us for 10 months in a year and for their vacation they go to their homes. These children are from economically poor families and through our children homes rural boys and girls are given opportunity to get educated and look for skills development in pursuit of their future.

During this pandemic (Covid-19) while taking care of our health and safety we reached out to hundreds of families with dry rations, supply of medicine, alleviating their sufferings through traumatic counselling by TV programs and radio messages, we too took care of the terminally ill viz HIV patients, victims of Covid-19 (through sanitation, awareness programs, supplying of nutrition food and herbal, ayervedic drinks etc).

So friends, I request you to support our ministers. Thanking you in advance for your greater help that you are extending towards our missions in India and other countries. May God bless you all.
