

October 3, 2021 TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FROM OUR PASTOR

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that (paragraph 352) "the church venerates the angels who help her on her earthly pilgrimage and protect every human being." Paragraph 334 states "the whole life of the Church benefits from the mysterious and powerful help of the angels."

Perhaps that seems abstract. The angels are spiritual beings. We don't see them at work, unless granted by God for our particular good. Maybe we don't give them much thought.

First off we probably should more often not just think of them but thank them. The Church venerates angels. What does that mean? Venerate is a high level of respect and attention. This past week we had two feast days for the angels. September 29th was the feast of the Archangels (St. Michael, St. Gabriel, and St. Raphael). Then on October 2nd we had the feast for the Holy Guardian Angels.

All angels are messengers of God. Their messages can hold good news or guidance. An archangel has a message of greater importance for the whole world; like Gabriel going to Mary.

Our guardian angel carries to each of us a message of God's care and compassion for each of us as individuals. They are assigned to us and are with us as long as we are on earth.

As spiritual beings we do not see them. They are beyond our senses. Some people have been given that privilege of seeing or talking with their particular angel. Others, even those I have talked with, have seen angels at Mass around the altar. We join them in singing Holy, Holy, Holy at Mass. They are there and want to be with Jesus all the more so as He is present Body, Blood, soul and divinity upon the altar. We get to receive Him in the Holy Eucharist while they clearly see His glory and praise Him at Mass.

There are a number of devotions for the angels. The Angel of God prayer is very common and often taught to your children as a night time prayer. There is the chaplet of St. Michael. There are litanies to the guardian angles and one to St. Michael. There are numerous shrines and churches that are named after the angels or Archangels. A famous example is Mont-Saint-Michel abbey in France.

So I encourage you to take that time each day and ask your guardian angel to assist you. Be specific in what you need and the help that benefits you to grow in holiness. We may not always take the angels and their help as seriously as we should. There are many temptations around us and there are areas of our lives that we are working on; why not get that extra help that can assist us to live as God wants us to?

O angel of God, my guardian, by the divine goodness I am entrusted to your charge. Enlighten, keep, govern, and direct me this day. Almighty and everlasting God, You who have created me in Your own image, and have deputized Your holy angel to be my guardian, grant me, by his guidance and protection, to pass successfully through all spiritual and physical dangers, and when this life is ended, to enjoy eternal happiness with him. Amen.


