

October 9, 2022 TWENTY EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FROM OUR PASTOR

October is the month of the Rosary. The rosary would be seen by many as "the catholic prayer". Many Popes over the centuries have written greatly about the rosary. Pope St. John Paul II added the Luminous Mysteries through his writings. The saints in general have written about it and all of them have encouraged the praying of the rosary.

As you can see in this bulletin there is an insert of what we are doing for the month here at St. Patrick to promote the rosary. Looking ahead, plan to have your rosary blessed if you are not sure if it ever was or have a newer one that has not been blessed.

October 7th is the feast day of Our Lady of the Rosary. St. Pius V gave us this feast in 1573. The rosary itself goes back centuries before it. As a means of prayer it is meant to help us contemplate the faith. It also roots us in the scriptures. The Our Father comes from Jesus Himself. The beginning of the Hail Mary is from the archangel Gabriel's greeting to Mary. The Glory Be prayer goes back to the 4th century by the monks who added it to the end of the psalms they prayed, expressing the praise the angels gave in the Gloria that we sing at Mass.

Each of the mysteries is a moment in the life of Jesus and Mary. So to meditate on a mystery brings us into the scriptures, especially the Gospels. Going through all the mysteries will help us reflect on the life of Jesus. As disciples of Jesus we should know His life.

As a devotion there are many ways to offer the rosary. It can be prayed individually or with a group. Some have added prayers at the conclusion of the rosary. There is the scriptural rosary that brings in even more scripture to reflect upon. Particular intentions may be offered at the beginning of the rosary or the whole rosary might be offered for a special need.

Mary herself has promoted the praying of the rosary through her apparitions. When she appears to people, prayer is one of the main things that she asks of them. Often she asks that the rosary be prayed for the intention of peace. Our Lady of Fatima is a good example of that.

Perhaps for some the rosary seems too easy or repetitive. The saints would disagree with you. No matter where we are in the spiritual life, the rosary can help us grow. So in the month of October I encourage you to pick up the rosary with new energy and allow Mary to guide you.

Since one of the mysteries is joyful, please enjoy the following.




