

# October 11, 2020 TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### FROM OUR PASTOR

We are a people of prayer. Gathering for the liturgy defines us. The Mass is a huge part of our lives. Yet our busy lives can keep us from praying as we want. So there are a few liturgical news items I would like to share with you and invite you to be a part of.

Building on what we started last year during Religious Education, we will have Mass on the Wednesdays that we have Religious Education. It will be at 6 pm and as a daily Mass it will be done by 6:30 pm so that our students can be on time for class that evening. This is open to anyone who can make it. Please watch the bulletin to know if there is class, if so there will be Mass that night.

November 6th will be the First Friday of that month. In the past the First Friday was a time for adoration throughout most of the day. Things have changed in our world. Trying to take that into account and yet allow time for people to spend with the Lord is a balance. At the Sacred Worship committee meeting we discussed offering some time and by making some changes perhaps allow others who may not have been able to attend in the past. So for the next number of months we will have First Friday adoration starting at noon and ending at 6 pm with benediction.

All other Fridays of the month remain as they are with a holy hour from 3-4 pm. They conclude with benediction. It is hoped that with a noon start our school children will have an opportunity to be a part of it. But also those who are working would have some time too. We are looking at having committees be responsible for certain hours as we did before the world shut down back in March. During adoration your focus is fully on the Lord. But adoration also allows for people to spread out throughout the whole church and come and go as their schedule allows.

October 7th was the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. The whole month of October is the month of the Rosary. A good reminder and encouragement. Perhaps that is not a usual practice that you or your family does. Nonetheless this would be a good time to pick it up or try again. On Thursdays we are offering the Rosary on Facebook at 2 pm. As you pray through all the mysteries it opens for us the scriptures, God's plan of salvation.

October 16th is the feast of St. Margaret Mary Alacoqoue. Jesus appeared to her encouraging her and asking her to celebrate a devotion to the Sacred Heart. Jesus incorporated her love of the Blessed Sacrament into it as a way of coming to know God's great love for His people. Jesus encouraged her and others to receive Holy Communion on First Friday. She was not fully believed during her lifetime, yet she left the Church a great legacy and concrete way to meditate on the heart of Jesus, His love and a way to live that out.

October is filled with many great opportunities for prayer. I encourage you to take some time and return to certain practices putting them back into your schedule or try something new that has been around and helped so many saints.


