FROM OUR PASTOR:

The Fifteen Promises Granted to those who Recite the Rosary

Dear people of God, Greetings from Fr. Cruz!!

The Holy Rosary is considered a perfect prayer because within it lies the awesome story of our salvation. With the Rosary in fact, we meditate the mysteries of joy, of sorrow, of glory and of light of Jesus and Mary. It's a simple prayer, humble so much like Mary. Here are the fifteen promises granted to those who recite the rosary. (**Given by Mary to St. Dominic and Blessed Alan de la Roche**)

- 1. Whoever shall faithfully serve me by the recitation of the Rosary, shall receive special graces.
- 2. I promise my special protection and the greatest graces to all those who shall recite the Rosary.
- 3. The Rosary shall be a powerful armor against hell, it will destroy vice, decrease sin, and defeat heresies.
- 4. The Rosary will cause virtue and good works to flourish; it will obtain for souls the abundant mercy of God.
- 5. The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the Rosary, shall not perish.
- 6. Whoever shall recite the Rosary devoutly, applying himself to the consideration of its sacred mysteries shall never be conquered by misfortune. **God will not chastise him in His justice, he shall not perish by an unprovided death;** if he be just, he shall remain in the grace of God, and become worthy of eternal life.
- 7. Whoever shall have a true devotion for the Rosary shall not die without the sacraments of the Church.
- **8.** Those who are faithful to recite the Rosary shall have during their life and at their death the light of God and the plentitude of His graces; at the moment of death, they shall participate in the merits of the saints in paradise.
- 9. I shall deliver from Purgatory those who have been devoted to the Rosary.
- 10. The faithful children of the Rosary shall merit a high degree of glory in Heaven.
- 11. You shall obtain all you ask of me by the recitation of the Rosary.
- 12. All those who propagate the Holy Rosary shall be aided by me in their necessities.
- **13.** I have obtained from my Divine Son that all the advocates of the Rosary **shall have for intercessors the entire** celestial court during their life and at the hour of death.
- 14. All who recite the Rosary are my sons and daughters, and brothers and sisters of my only Son JesusChrist.
- 15. Devotion of my Rosary is a great sign of predestination.
