

October 14, 2018 TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FROM OUR PASTOR:

This past week I was at the Fall Clergy conference in La Crosse. Each year there are topics that are covered so as to continue our education in a particular area each year. This year was a little different. Our speaker fell ill, a heart attack, a few weeks ago and was not ready or able to travel to lead us in a number of conferences in a few days. So that opened things up and gave us some options. The decision was made to focus on the upcoming project, Safe Haven Sunday. It reveals the damage that pornagraphy has done to our society and the difficulty of those involved to get out of its use. That is something we will be looking at as a diocese in the coming months and will be presented at all parishes.

From there the discussion was lead by the Bishop. He chose to focus on Bishops' cover up of clergy abuse. On the area of abuse, very little "new" abuse has been recorded since the Charter of 2002. The reports and media highlights have been about the years prior to 2002. That hardly makes it OK. Our Bishop has all the parishes in the diocese placing his letter in this week's bulletin. Please take the time to review it. The area of prayer is something we all needed to do so that healing can be a reality in the lives of those who suffered abuse.

First Friday is a specific time the Bishop is calling for prayer. I encourage you to find that time for prayer. Pray for healing, for truth, for courage, for needed graces. Our diocese has been touched by abuse in the past and is not immune to sinful behavior. Let us not overlook abuse elsewhere, in the home or school/workplace either. There is a lot of brokenness in society. Placing blame, denying or ignoring situations do not lead to healing or healthy families, schools, or churches.

The real answer to many questions of "how did that happen?" or "what was missed, ignored or denied over the years?" can only be answered by saints. That is, us!! We need to strive for holiness. Has that been on the top of our to-do list? How else can we look at situations and truly grasp what is or has gone on? When our hearts are beating with the Sacred Heart of Jesus are we going to be able to handle and answer questions that deal with broken lives and people. Jesus gave the Cross as an answer to evil in the world. The world thought that it had buried the problem of Jesus. His resurrection overcame their 'defeat' and gave new life to all who had fallen under the sway of the devil's story and defeatism.

In Mark's Gospel the Apostles ask "then who can be saved?" Jesus looked at them and said, "For human beings it is impossible, but not for God. All things are possible for God." Let us not look at our current situation and wonder who can be saved? Who is without sin? But remember that with God, all things are possible. Let us look to the ways we can invite Jesus into all aspects of our lives, whether broken or in need of strengthening.
