

October 18, 2020 TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FROM OUR PASTOR

World Mission Sunday. What does that mean to us? What is our connection to the rest of the world? Fr. Woodrow Pace (Mission Director for our diocese) tells us that "His Holiness reminds us, 'the call to mission, the invitation to step out of ourselves for love of God and neighbor presents itself as an opportunity for sharing, service and intercessory prayer.' The richness of World Mission Sunday involves all three."

Bishop Callahan goes on to speak about World Mission Sunday too. He says "the word-wide pandemic is challenging the mission of the Church in so many ways. Business and travel shutdowns in India are causing hunger, and illnesses are going untreated in rural states. Education in much of Africa has come to a basic standstill crippling forward development."

It all sounds overwhelming and what could we do about it? There are online resources at www.missio.org/resources. Being aware of the needs of our brothers and sisters in the faith around the world is a start. Praying for them and learning about their situations will help us respond in prayer or support by our use of the World Mission envelopes.

As it is the month of the Rosary perhaps you have seen or heard about the mission rosary by Archbishop Fulton Sheen. The focus of the colors pointed to mission territory and was meant to help us focus on the Gospel being planted there. Each decade has a color. Blue for the Pacific. Green for Africa. Red is the Americas. Yellow is for Asia and the Middle East. White for Europe.

Added to the rosary and to give it a missionary focus the Mission Rosary can also be prayed in a special way, using the "Mission Mysteries" developed by Maryknoll's mission organization. These mysteries are:

- 1. The 1st Mission Mystery: The visit of the Magi, the first missioners (Matthew 2:1,11)
- 2. The 2nd Mission Mystery: Jesus talks with the Samaritan woman, crossing borders/breaking down boundaries (John 4:28)
- 3. The 3rd Mission Mystery: Jesus cures the centurion's servant, acts of healing and service (Luke 7:2)
- 4. The 4th Mission Mystery: The conversion of Paul, expanding the faith to the Gentiles, the "other," and thus the world (Acts 9:20)
- 5. The 5th Mission Mystery: Jesus sends out His disciples, we're all called to mission (Mark 16:15).

I must admit that I did not know about the "Mission Mysteries". But that is part of the richness of a devotion and the depth of our practice of the faith. There is always room to grow. Please take the time to learn and pray about the missions this month.

Deepening our friendship with Jesus is most needed during these challenging times! Our relationship with Jesus is essential to live a life with peace, joy and fulfillment. The following explanation about the *Sign of the Cross* helps us become more aware of the meaning of the words and the gesture, so that we pray from our heart.

Praying The Sign of the Cross: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."

- As Catholics, we always begin and end our prayer with the Sign of the Cross, which is a prayer not just an introduction. When we make the Sign of the Cross, we want to become more aware of how much God loves us, by being mindful that we are "Crossing" ourselves as a reminder that Jesus died on the Cross for our sins.
- Each time that we make the Sign of the Cross and pray the words, we give praise to the three Persons of the Blessed Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- In the words of the *Sign of the Cross*, we are praying in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The words "In the name of" are synonymous with "in the Person of". We are placing ourselves under the power and authority of the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, which means we are calling upon the power of the name of God. It is essential to know that the prayer, the *Sign of the Cross*, is not complete when leaving out the words "In the name of."
- "Christians are baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit: not in their names, for there is only one God, the almighty Father, His only Son and the Holy Spirit: The Most Holy Trinity." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraph 233)
