

# October 27, 2019 THIRTIETHSUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### FROM OUR PASTOR

During one of the meetings of the parish council the idea of a suggestion box was put forth. The council was looking for ideas and ways to create a dialogue within the parish. The council knew that it may only be a means of venting for some. And that is OK. As we know the council is made up of members of the parish who are all volunteers. Working with volunteers means that things are not always "on schedule" as we so often figure that things we want should be done right now. We are very much in a 24/7 culture. Order it online and we expect the next day delivery. So this is a little different.

I want to thank those who have put forth ideas. All the sheets have been read at the council meetings. We have had a few changes in membership as two have completed their term of service to the parish and I am grateful for their time and energy. We have had some members going through some trials, so prayers are appreciated.

Some of the areas of discussion were passed on to the appropriate committees within the parish for them to work out. For example music for the weekend Masses. That was passed on to the Sacred Worship committee. In that area we are blessed with a number of volunteers that give of their time and talents. They are working within the guidelines for providing music to raise the level of praise at Mass.

Another area is human behavior. I think that parishes deal with this all the time and some things are truly accidental but impact people's time of prayer. For example cell phones going off. As we discussed, even when people are told or signs put up, phones can and will go off as some people are on call for work or family situations that need immediate response. Most people figure they have turned it off or that others would know not to call them on a Sunday morning but that happens. So yes, please check your phones before coming to Mass and pray for those who need to take a call.

Other thoughts have been for people to keep in mind the flu season and offering the sign of peace to those around you. The area of modesty also was mentioned for those coming to Mass. We don't want to turn people away for the way they dress, therefore we will leave it up to parents and adults to make that call. We pray they will make good choices. Many of our Eucharistic Ministers do use sanitizer from the credence table but it does happen that they forget. We do offer continuing education classes for adults, if you have an idea please stop in to the office to further discuss them.

Another area was funerals. You will notice that we do list those who have died in the bulletin for prayer. It is when people die and others want to know funeral details. Unfortunately we at the parish do not always have that information and are not able to announce things at Mass. With cremations, services can be months away even though they have died, the rectory may not been contacted. So timing can be an issue and all things may happen within the week so there wouldn't be anything to announce or at times families request nothing to be said. Some are choosing not to even have a funeral. When obituaries are available, we try to post a link our Parish Facebook page.

So please pray for our parish council and fellow parishioners since all of us need God's grace.


**Baptism:** Baptisms are celebrated during Mass on weekends. Parents may request baptism for their child by calling the rectory to schedule a preparation class for Baptism.
