THIRTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FROM OUR PASTOR

Happy All Hallows Eve. It is meant to be a time of prayer. Children from poorer families would go from door to door willing to pray for deceased family members. In return often baked goods or some other food, sometimes money was offered in thanks for their prayers. That day of prayer would then lead us to All Saints Day. A day we could celebrate those who had arrived into our eternal home. But as we know often good things are taken and put into a new context. Thus we have Halloween and all the candy, cards, and spooks that really don't help us grow in prayer and consideration for loved ones who have died. So if you are going door-to-door trick or-treating this year, pray for all those homes that you stop at.

We as a parish are also still in need of prayers for a new DRE. Keep asking the Lord to send us who we need to help our young people grow in their faith.

Another area for prayers is vocations to the priesthood, especially from our parish. If you recall a few weeks ago in the bulletin we had a nice introduction of Brandon Lea. Since that time he has moved out of the Journey program. So keep God's plans for him in your prayers. It is a reminder and encouragement for our young people to look at all options that God may be placing before them. Religious life is one that we do not see at the parish level. Many orders work in larger cities or with specific apostolates that we do not find in rural areas.

Remember that Tuesday November 1st is a Holy Day of obligation. We have the school Mass at 8 am which we invite you to be a part of. Then that evening at 5:30 pm there will be a Mass for all the saints. Then on November 2nd Masses will commemorate All Souls. The Knights of Columbus will also be recalling the members they have lost in the past year at the evening Mass. In the month of November it is recommended that you visit the cemetery of a loved one and pray for them. Google prayers for visiting a cemetery and offer them any time during the month.

Feast Days remind us there are things to celebrate. The saints have made it home/to heaven. They have left us a great example and are a source of encouragement. That should fill us with joy. So with that in mind here is a little humor to make our days a little more joyful.

# Food Pantry News

Thanksgiving is one of my favorite holidays. I take the time to look back over the year to remember to say thanks for all that I have. The pantry wants to say to all of you -- We are so very thankful for everyone's help at the pantry, by volunteering,

donations and prayers. We could not do it without you. As of Nov. 1, the pantry is averaging 130 different families (350 different people) each month. We are still providing 2 weeks' worth of food because of Covid. We are a choice pantry, families do get to choose what they can use because of your generous donations.

We are asking everyone that wishes to make a much needed donation to the pantry during the following months, please do so with cash donations, if possible. We are able to purchase food at a much lower cost than you can buy it at the store and it enables us to get what we are short of when we need it. Thank you for considering this. There are many ways to get your donations doubled during the next 6 weeks.

**\*\*\*Bank of Mauston Food Drive** – During the month of November, **the Bank will be matching cash donations:** A \$25 donation enables us to purchase a case of 24 cans of fruit or veggies and the bank buys us another case! We are getting these items through Second Harvest. They deliver to us. Cased items are easier to store and we can get items in as we have space. Their drive runs until Nov. 30.

**\*\*\*The School Food Drives** – They also are doing holiday food drives that will also be matched by the Bank of Mauston.

**\*\*\* Yes, There is a Canadian Pacific Railway (CPR) Holiday Train in Mauston this year! They will be making their usual donation to us.** Thank Goodness. The date is set for Dec. 10 at 4PM at the Division Street crossing as usual. The Bank of Mauston will be matching donations for this as well. Look for the posters at your church.
