FROM OUR PASTOR

This Saturday is All Hallowed Eve or Halloween for so many. The first is the vigil of All Saints Day, a great feast day for all the saints in heaven. The second is what is celebrated with candy and tricks. Both have a bit of history nonetheless All Hallowed Eve came first. Even the colors of black and orange came from the church. The black of the vestment and the orange of the candles, they were not bleached white as they are now.

November 1st is All Saints Day, which is a great day to thank God for the many witnesses we have of the faith and source of encouragement for all of us. The saints are so different from each other, they are not cookie cut-outs. Each of the saints responded to the Lord's invite to radically follow Him. And they did! It is good to consider our patron saints and the saint on the day of our birth. For many people around the world, their name day is more important than their birthday. So who is the saint on your day?

November 2nd is for All Souls. That Mass will be at 9 am. The whole month of November is a wonderful time to pray for all who have died. We are not the judge of anyone and do not know a person's heart. So pray or offer sacrifices for those who have died. There are ways to earn an indulgence for our loved ones who have died. Details are in the Youth Newsletter for this month.

November 6th will be First Friday and starting this month we are having adoration from Noon to 6 pm with benediction to close that time of adoration. Feel free to stop in at any time for whatever length of time you have to be with Jesus. If you know you have an hour, feel free to sign up, letting us know that hour does have someone who can spend the time with Jesus.

November 7th is First Saturday for the month and Mass will be at 8 am. Following Mass there will be confessions.

We are planning to host the Ecumenical Thanksgiving Service on November 25th at 7 pm. A number of the churches will be here and it is our opportunity to gather as a community in prayer and thanksgiving for blessings received. During the service the collection is for the Christmas baskets that will be given out in December. Pray that we can gather and is a time many can be generous in support of those who are in need in our community. Covid-19 has not gotten rid of needs in our community, it has only made it more difficult to address those needs safely.

October 31st was a big day for the Knights of Columbus. Fr. Michael J. McGivney, the founder of the Knights, was beatified. That is a step away from being a saint. There is a miracle required for that to happen. Being a blessed allows for the Church to encourage his cult. Which means the Church can now publicly call upon his name in prayers at Mass and other liturgical events by those connected to the Blessed. (The Knights of Columbus and in his own home diocese.) This also means that the cause for his canonization can move forward since it has been shown that he has lived a life of virtue. So now any Knight can call out in prayer, "Blessed Fr. Michael J. McGivney, pray for us."

The pantry quarantines items before they are distributed. Cased items are easier to store and require a shorter quarantine time.
