

November 3, 2019 THIRTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FROM OUR PASTOR

We have already celebrated the Holy day of All Saints and marked All Souls day. These feasts can raise questions for people. I offer a few of them and answers given to us by the Sacred Worship office of the diocese. The first question is "What is the ideal order of funeral liturgies relative to cremation?" When cremation is chosen, the preferred sequence for the funeral rites is the celebration of the Funeral Mass with the body of the deceased present, then cremation, and then the interment or entombment of the created remains. Such a sequence respects the integrity of the funeral rites, and gives relatives and friends the occasion to pay proper respect to the body of the deceased before it is cremated. (CBD; also OCF 418)

A second question often raised is "Can cremated remains be spread, divided, or kept in the home?" No: it is not permitted to scatter cremated remains over a favorite place, and it is not permitted to keep cremated remains in one's home or place other than a cemetery. (OCF 417) The integrity of the cremated remains is to be respected. The cremated remains of one deceased person may not mixed with the cremated remains of another person. It is not permitted to divide the cremated remains and inter or entomb them in more than one place. (CBD; also AR 6-7).

The quoted documents are from the Vatican (AR--Ad resurgendum cum Christo), the USCCB (OFC--Order of Christian Funerals) and the diocese of La Crosse (CBD--On the Christian Burial of the Dead).

Cremation being allowed is something relatively new in the Church. Around the world it is or was depending on location, associated with non-Christian burial rites and beliefs. The Church as a minority in some places (like India) stand out because we bury the body following the example of Jesus spending time in the tomb. Perhaps in the US we take for granted a Christian mind set and only look at the utility or expense of a funeral. We can overlook the world wide, centuries long experience of the Church and look to our particular situation and wonder why can't we do what we want. Being a part of the Body of Christ reminds us that things, like life and death, are bigger than ourselves. Loss and grief does not follow the path we want, which is at times, to be over quickly. Today's desire is to avoid all suffering and loss of any kind.

So it is important as a Church to celebrate the saints and remember and pray for the holy and poor souls who need our efforts to apply the graces won for us on the cross as a way to prepare and be purified for heaven; to be holy with the All Holy.

To lighten the mood and remind ourselves of the joy the Spirit of Life brings us, enjoy:

- -- Why did the cowboy ride his horse? Because it was too heavy to carry.
- --The past, the present, and the future walked into a bar. It was tense.
- --I bought the world's worst thesaurus yesterday. Not only was it terrible, it's terrible.
- --What did the skydiver say when her pack didn't open? Chute!!
