

# November 4, 2018 THIRTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### FROM OUR PASTOR:

November is often associated with the Holy Souls. We celebrated the Saints on the Holy Day. They are a marvelous witness to us. We are approaching over 4,000 canonized saints in the Church. So truly there is a saint for everyone, we just have to look or allow them to find us. Of course we keep in mind and heart all those who have gone before us in faith. We remain connected to them in the Body of Christ, the Church on earth and beyond. So it is always appropriate to pray for those who have died. They can use the grace to arrive at the Beatific Vision or those graces will be redirected to those in purgatory, awaiting God's mercy.

It is our faith that unites us in Christ. Faith that we enter on the day of our baptism. So I offer you a reflection on baptism by Douglas Bushman.

"The first 'profession of faith' is made during Baptism. The symbol of faith is first and foremost the baptismal creed. (CCC 189)

Growing up in a family, one gradually learns about his parents and their love. Similarly, faith grows by continually discovering the meaning of the baptismal gift of new life and God's love revealed by Christ. 'We have come to know and to believe in the love God has for us' (1 John 4:16). Knowing better the baptismal profession of faith means knowing better the God who fully revealed his love for us in Jesus Christ. This means believing that the Father sent his Son to love us 'to the end' (John 13:1), and that together they send the Holy Spirit of love to dwell in our hearts (Romans 5:5). The Father's love is seen in creation, his plan of redemption, and sending his Son to save us. The Son's love is revealed in the forgiving mercy, teaching, miracles, Passion, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension of Christ. The Spirit's love sanctifies us, dwells in our hearts, and moves us to confess Jesus Christ as Lord (1 Cor. 12:3), to call God our Father (Romans 8:15), and to know him as Lord and Giver of life. As faith's understanding of God's love grows, the 'Yes' of faith becomes ever more mature."

Growing in the faith may take many roads. We may stop along the way, for whatever reason, or we may charge ahead with new vigor at certain moments of our life. It all begins at baptism. What a powerful moment that seems so simple. Yet our God knows us and does not overwhelm us, but wants to draw us in. I encourage you to take that journey of faith, walk with Jesus daily, growing in maturity by responding to His grace and making that effort to bear fruit. There are so many ways to do that. Watch the bulletin, web page and Facebook for those moments that we can journey together. Carrying the load is easier with others, so invite others to walk with you or say 'yes' if invited by others to journey with them in coming to know our loving Father and his great plan of redemption for us all.
