In the larger community there is a need to keep the Food Pantry successful in their mission of feeding the hungry. 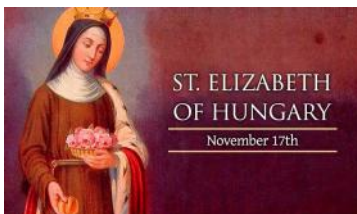
