THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FROM OUR PASTOR

Wow, we have many more poor souls to pray for. This last week we had the funerals for: Mary Ella Bires, Dallas Enz, Lucille Ryczek, Bernadine Seitz, Mike Kelley and Genevieve (Dolly) Vinopal. For some perhaps it was more obvious that day was coming closer. It still does not make things easier. For this reason, I would encourage you to think ahead. Often families are making decisions so quickly and many of them are to be made in just a few days; it can be overwhelming. Have that discussion of what your wishes are. Sometimes adult children are not practicing the Catholic faith and are uneasy about making arrangements for their parents. Please put your wishes in writing to help everyone involved to make the decisions that you want. Just because your parents were in the nursing home or homebound for some years does not mean they don't want to have a full funeral at their parish.

Let us use the following quote from the pastoral letter, On the Christian Burial of the Dead, to help us reflect on what we can do for them.

"Praying for the dead is an integral part of our Christian life; it is one of the spiritual works of mercy. Our prayer for the dead both honors their memory and expresses our faithful love as we assist them to be purified of any temporal punishment due to sin and to reach their final destiny and lasting home with God. *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* instructs us about the importance of prayer for the dead:

From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. The Church also commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead. (No.1032)

Prayer should be encouraged for all the dead. Even though a person may have lived a most exemplary life from all appearances, no one knows the soul of the departed and the temptations which he or she may have suffered in life. Often enough, as we know from the lives of the saints, those who practice the greatest virtue also suffer the greatest temptations. It is a grave injustice to the dead to say that they do not need our prayer. Rather, we should continue to express our love for the faithful departed by our prayers for their eternal rest. (Cf. OCF, Nos. 6-7)"

Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord and let perpetual light shine upon them.
