# FROM OUR PASTOR

We had a great evening with the Scheonschatt Sisters speaking of vocations to some of the young ladies of the parish. In the spring we will have a talk and dinner for the young men. For many the vocation that they are being called to is the married life. The scriptures are a great source of guidance for any vocation. "The Proverbs explained: A blueprint for Christian living" gives us a point of reflection on marriage and how to build it up.

A continual dripping on a rainy day and a contentious woman/man are alike. Prov. 27:15. "Why do the writers of the Proverbs compare constant nagging and nitpicking to 'dripping on a rainy day'? Picture an ancient Israelite house, which had a roof made of flimsy boards topped with packed soil and straw. When it rained, the water would eventually go through the straw, pick up some mud and dirt, and drip through the cracks between the boards of the ceiling. You can just imagine how annoying and frustrating (and messy) that would be.

This constant, noisy, muddy drip is what unresolved quarreling is like. Once it gets started, it is difficult to figure out how to stop it quickly, and it becomes a source of annoyance and even anger--enough to drive anyone crazy. Like a drip you can't escape, constant nagging and unresolved tensions in marriage make everything--even the good times--difficult to enjoy.

And what is it that prevents this dripping? The only way for an ancient Israelite to keep it under control was to ensure that his home was constantly maintained. He'd have to take care of the roof by changing the straw, replenishing the soil and keeping the boards in good shape.

By analogy, the way a husband and wife can avoid that continuous nagging--that nit-nit-nit-picking--is to keep their relationship in constant repair. A couple can't avoid this relationship maintenance because eventually it will rain. There will be bills to be paid, stress from overwork, health issues, problems with raising the children, and so on. If a couple is not ready when the problems and challenges pour like cats and dogs, that annoying drip-drip-drip will drive them mad until they end up fighting like cats and dogs.

Communication between a husband and wife is one of the most important maintenance issues in any marriage. They need always to pay close attention to their lines of communication. And what makes the difference between quarrelsome arguments and healthy communication? The first step is to communicate honestly,but without judgment. This doesn't mean that you don't point out things that are causing difficulty in your relationship. That kind of avoidance just allows things to get worse. Rather, you must communicate in a way that informs the other of a difficulty--something that he or she probably didn't recognize--without blaming. Blame and judgment lead, naturally, to defensiveness, and then to hard-heartedness.

Maintenance of a relationship is a two-person job; you and your spouse have to be in it together. Both avoiding those repairs and arguing based on blame and judgment will allow the drips to continue--and to get worse. And the longer that annoying drip, drip, drip goes on, the harder it will be to fight through it to complete the hard work of repairing the roof--or your marriage."

All that advice from a single line of scripture. Perhaps it is a good idea to keep delving into the Word of God for needed guidance in all parts of our lives.
