

November 20, 2022 OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

FROM OUR PASTOR

We celebrate the great solemnity of Christ the King of the Universe. He who is to reign over all. His kingdom is to extend over the whole world. His message is to be heard by all.

Chris Stefanick in his article "A Return to the Kerygma: the path to renewal" offers a few pointers on that.

"The essential content of the Gospel Kerygma is:

- 1. God has created man for relationship with himself, a relationship destined to culminate in the eternal joy of divine love. (Jn15:11; Rev. 19:6-9)
- 2. Man chose to reject God's created purpose and is "broken". (Rom 3:23)
- 3. Jesus Christ, Savior and Lord, brings us back to our purpose and heavenly destination through the paschal Mystery, which also reveals his love for us. (Rom 5:8)
- 4. Metanoia, which literally means a "change in mind," or conversion, and faith are our response to this reality. (Mk 1:15)
- 5. We're called to join ourselves to God's family, the Church, where we experience these saving mysteries in our lives through sacraments, prayer, community and shared mission. (Acts 2:38-42)"

This good news is meant to be proclaimed everywhere by all believers. By our baptism this is our job too. We can see that it is done differently by different people and their circumstances throughout history. Chris goes on to give us the example of Sts. Peter and Paul.

"The difference in the Petrine and Pauline Kerygma is that Jesus' identity as Savior and Lord had been fully revealed and actualized by the paschal Mystery. Thus, in the Acts of the Apostles, the kerygma is complete. The Cross and resurrection are always explicitly mentioned as part of the announcement of the Gospel. In addition, the call to join oneself to the sacramental and communal life of the Church, which is now established, is clear. In Acts 2, when the crowds asks what to do in response to the Good News, Peter immediately responds, "be baptized" (Acts 2:38), and the Church is depicted as gathering for the Eucharist and fellowship.

The point of the kerygma (the existence of God and his creative purpose) is only explicitly mentioned when the target audience needs it. When Paul proclaims the Gospel to the Jews, this is obviously not the case (Acts 13), but when he proclaims the Gospel to the Athenians, he reminds them that there is a personal God (no mere statue), and that "he is not far from any one of us" (Acts 17:27)."

As we celebrated World Mission Sunday in October, we are reminded that the Good News needs to be shared always and everywhere. So it does take all of us to accomplish this mission. It is not a matter of comparing ourselves or our knowledge levels to others. We have our living relationship with Jesus, we are strengthened by daily prayer and regular reception of the sacraments; we are prepared. So it is simply a matter of responding to each opportunity and sharing the Good News that we hold deep in our hearts. As others get to know Jesus because of us, the Kingdom grows and His reign will spread to the ends of the earth.




