FROM OUR PASTOR

I would like to share some news from Mr. Stanke.

"I am dealing with every COVID symptom there is—fever, chills, cough, persistent headache, body aches, fatigue, dizziness, weakness, and gastrointestinal issues. The nurses and doctors can't do much but recommend hydration and rest. Eating is out of the question. The only thing keeping me out of the hospital is that my breathing has not yet been compromised.

I contacted Father this week and told him that I need to resign my position. I don't know when I will recover, but this has hit me so hard, I have a completely different perspective on this coronavirus, and I cannot risk my wife's or my family's health by possibly contracting this again or becoming a carrier.

I do want you to know that I appreciate how welcoming you all have been during my short tenure as Interim Principal. You have a great Catholic school, with great students, parents, and faculty and staff. You have an awesome pastor in Fr. John. He is truly inspiring and is so dedicated to the parish and school. Please do stay safe and healthy and may God continue to bless you."

So yes, 2020 is still very interesting. As Mr. Stanke mentioned we have a great faculty that is pulling together as a true team. Nonetheless, please keep all of our staff in your prayers. I think that our families too, whether at St. Patrick's school or at Mauston need prayers too. Everyday seems to be a challenge and things change constantly.

Jesus is our source of hope. We are not to give up. It is exciting that in the coming weeks we have some baptisms. Many of them will be outside of Mass for immediate family only. But we as a parish can rejoice with them and their children that will become children of God through that sacrament. So watch the bulletin for those names of the newly baptized and hold them up in prayer. It has been a great asset to have FORMED in our parish so that our families can safely prepare for that sacrament. It is also great to use to keep ourselves growing in the faith. If you have not been on FORMED I encourage you to do so or if it has been awhile go back and enjoy shows, talks, and podcasts that can help you deepen your faith.

An event of faith is our Mauston Ecumenical Thanksgiving service that will be held on Wednesday November 25th at 7 pm here at St. Patrick. The pastors of Mauston try to meet once a month; praying together and planning a few events for the year that the faith communities of Mauston can be a part of. 2020 has impacted that too in this past year. Nonetheless this event is a time of prayer and collection for the Christmas baskets that will be handed out on December 19th at Faith Christian church. Unfortunately we will not be able to have a reception as we have done in past years. Still it is an activity that builds the community which we need at this time.

On Thanksgiving Day Mass will be at 9 am.

Four Reasons to be Thankful

- Those who cultivate the habit of thankfulness experience true Christian joy. And isn't this something that we desire? When we count our many blessings, our attitude can turn away from any discouragement and lead us to be more generous with others.
- 2. The more we hear "thank you" come from our mouth, the more we notice what people are doing for us and it can help to shift an attitude of discouragement as well. This Thanksgiving, consider a person in your family you need to verbally thank for something specific; or thank a family member for who they are and what they mean to you. Growing in the habit of being thankful to God and others is well worth the effort.
- 3. We have every reason to be thankful. Jesus gave His life for us, experiencing the worst possible pain on the Cross, so that we can have eternal life with Him forever. And the Cross is in the shape of the letter "t" which reminds us of the word "thanksgiving." Giving thanks to Jesus will foster greater humility as we recognize His incredible love for us.
