

November 29, 2020 FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

FROM OUR PASTOR

I hope that your Thanksgiving Day, however you celebrated, went well. This is also the last weekend of the gun deer hunt, so keep safe and St. Hubert pray for us!

November is also the month to pray for those who have died. For the whole month we are able to gain an indulgence for the dead. So visiting a cemetery, having gone to confession, received communion and offered prayers for the Holy Father and the deceased will be a great source of grace for them. We can pray for the holy souls, offer our sufferings to assist them and have Masses said. A friend of mine has come up with a great way to help the Holy Souls. It is the "Holy Souls Garage Sale", which is rather unique. There is a letter in the back of the church that explains in more detail what they are trying to do in 2020 since they couldn't have a garage sale this year. "Being flexible" seems to be a watch phrase and approach we need to take on just about everything we are doing at this time.

For many the concern for health, their own or family and friends, have kept them away from Mass and other gatherings. Getting back to anything takes effort, that first step can seem rather large when we have not done or gone somewhere in awhile. So if it has been awhile since you have been to Mass, perhaps try one of the daily Masses. Tuesday is at 5:30 pm and Wednesday (when there are Religious Ed classes) Mass is at 6 pm. Wednesday and Thursday are often school Masses with the students so Friday is a better option at 8 am. The crowds are small and lots of room to spread out. Getting back into any habit takes that first step.

Looking ahead, Christmas is coming! How quickly things go and this time of year can be busy and this year different. So it does take planning. The 4 pm Christmas Eve Mass has always been a big one. But 2020 is different. We will not be having a "Children's Mass" on Christmas Eve. Family and grandparents from all over were there to see their family members in the living nativity scene or in the choir. It was always a big draw for many, so it is a popular Mass.

This year for the 4 pm Mass we are going to put out an on-line sign up. With that, will be a paper sign up sheet in the back of church that will be updated regularly. We still need to social distance and maintain our 25% capacity which has not been a problem for normal weekend Masses. Christmas Eve is a special case. Our sign up format will be sent out to school families and parishioners whose email addresses we have at the parish office in the near future. The paper sheets will be put in the back of the church. This is meant to be a barometer so that we can plan here at the parish. We don't want to not let people be there for Mass. Nonetheless we want everyone to be safe at the same time. So not to panic or worry about things, but do watch in the coming days for the sign up opportunities.

Christmas Masses will also be at 11 pm on Christmas Eve and 10 am on Christmas Day. By signing up for the 4 pm Christmas Eve Mass, you are letting us know what kind of planning we need to do so that as many who want to be at Mass for Christmas can

If you did not receive a pledge card in the mail, please give the rectory a call and we will send one out. **FORMED PICK OF THE WEEK ~ St. Giuseppe Moscati: Doctor to the Poor ~** Giuseppe Moscati, "the holy physician of Naples," as a medical doctor and layman in the early twentieth century who came from an aristocratic family and devoted his medical career to serving the poor. He was also a medical school professor and a pioneer in the field of biochemistry whose research led to the discovery of insulin as a cure for diabetes.

Moscati regarded his medical practice as a lay apostolate, a ministry to his suffering fellowmen. Before examining a patient or engaging in research, he would place himself in the presence of God. He encouraged his patients to receive the sacraments. Dr. Moscati treated poor patients free of charge, and he would often send someone home with an envelope containing a prescription and a 50-lire note.

When Mount Vesuvius erupted in 1906, Dr. Moscati evacuated a nursing home in the endangered area, personally moving the frail and infirm patients to safety minutes before the roof of the building collapsed. He also served beyond the call of duty during the 1911 cholera epidemic and treated some 3,000 soldiers during World War I.

Moscati was outspoken in his opposition to the unfair practices of nepotism and bribery that often influenced appointments at that time. He could have pursued a brilliant academic career, taken a professorial chair, and devoted more time to research, but he preferred to continue working with patients and to train interns.

Giuseppe Moscati died in 1927 at forty-six years old, was beatified in 1975, and declared a saint by Pope John Paul II in 1987. His feast day is November 16.
