

# December 8, 2019 SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

#### FROM OUR PASTOR

Advent is a great season. It is filled with such great potential. As the start of the new liturgical year, we start fresh. Perhaps it is a time to rebuild your habit of attending Mass. Or it can be a time to look forward to celebrating our communal penance service, opening ourselves to God's grace and mercy.

This season has some great feasts and saints that allow us to celebrate, seeing God's plan of salvation unfolding in their lives. St. Francis Xavier is a wonderful example of the missionary spirit we are all called to have in sharing Jesus with others. His travel to the ends of the earth and willingness to put the Gospel first is a great challenge. Yet we can also share the Good News right where we are with family, friends, co-workers, or classmates; which actually may be more difficult than traveling as a missionary.

St. John Damascene wrote great works of theology and is a doctor of the Church. Perhaps reading dense theology is not our idea of a good time or wonder what does that have to do with me? Yet as he wrote on the Incarnation, Jesus in the flesh, he reminds us that we can see God. He was with us in concrete real ways. How does that play out? Centuries later St. Francis of Assisi would create for us the manger scene. Baby Jesus, God that we can see and picture.

Of course the beloved St. Nicholas. Over time his work of charity was reduced to the giving of gifts, material gifts. Not that it is a bad thing at all, but any of the saints would agree that Jesus Himself is the greatest of gifts. Faith, Hope and Love are not things we can wrap up but some thing we can share all year long.

The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is our patronal feast day as a nation. Throughout the Advent season we will be hearing about Mary full of grace responding to God's call to be the mother of God. She is always leading us to her Son. Her conception without sin is a great sign of Jesus at work and the unfolding of the plan of salvation that began in the garden after the fall. Mass for the feast day is at 7 pm on December 9th.

There are many other saints in the season that can inspire us. I encourage you to learn more about them. There are many resources out there like our parish library, many videos that can be found on FORMED. On your smart phones there are apps that can help you learn more about those who lived the faith out in ordinary ways and the miraculous.

Beyond the saints there are devotions like the Advent wreath and the Jesse tree that allow us to grow in the faith and are very concrete that we can touch and see. Devotions have a great deal of symbolism that reminds us of the richness of our faith.

With this new season and new year in the Church may you be open to the new ways that God is calling you to live the faith in His Son with even greater joy. Happy Advent.
