FROM OUR PASTOR

Rose Sunday. Rejoice Sunday. We are deeper into the Advent season. We have been preparing our hearts and heeding the words of St. John the Baptist from last week and repenting, turning our hearts to the Lord who is coming. It is that sense of anticipation we are to be building. The high feast days of the Church gives us much to reflect upon. Yes we look forward to the birth of Jesus, but are we also enjoying the journey to get there?

The prophets, especially Isaiah, have much to say to us. Jesus has come to fulfill all their words. Jesus is the answer that the Father has spoken to His people. We also have St. John the Baptist preparing the way. Both his actions and words speak to us, calling us as the people of God ever closer to the Lord's plan for our salvation.

Some of the stops on this great trip are: Assisi, Loreto, San Giovanni Rotondo, Manoppello and Rome. Mass is planned for each day at some of the key sites. There will be brochures at the rectory for more information.

So there is much to prepare for. What do we look forward to? Plan for? How in the midst of all our plans, does Jesus fit in? That is the point of Advent, this season of preparation; especially on Rose/Rejoice Sunday knowing how much closer our Lord is to coming to us!
