There is an interesting legend of how a mother was cleaning the house in preparation for Christmas. Not a speck of dust was left and even all the spiders were banished from their cozy homes in the ceiling. It was Christmas eve and the Christmas Tree and the Crib was also decorated. But, at the farthest end of the attic, the spiders, after having been chased away and taken refuge in that corner, were feeling miserable. They too wished to see the Christmas Tree and especially have an encounter with Baby Jesus. But they were afraid, since the mother of the house would chase them away.
