THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY AND JOSEPH

FROM OUR PASTOR

From the birth of Christ, our God in the flesh, to the feast of the Holy Family. There is such richness in our faith. Such a great depth of theology that has given the saints much to contemplate and write about down through the centuries. Yet it also gives us simple images of the manger scene and baby Jesus; of Jesus, Mary and Joseph having to flee their home because of King Herod.

The scriptures have much to reveal to us and just a few lines can hold so much of God's plan for us and our salvation. Matthew's Gospel that we have this weekend gives us the story of the Holy Family having to leave for Egypt. All of this is put into place by an angel. The warning about King Herod does not seem like good news that we are used to hearing from an angel. Yet we can see in our own lives how God can work good out of a bad situation that we have found ourselves in.

One of the elements that we have in scripture is an archetype. We know that the stories in the Old Testament can foreshadow what happens in the New Testament. Hence we recall Moses bringing God's people out of Egypt. The great Exodus moment. Jesus being called out of Egypt fulfills the words of the prophets. It points to a whole new Exodus and new life in God that we are called to live as members of His family. As Moses brought them through the Red Sea we are brought through the waters of baptism that opens not just a land and a place to live, but eternity itself, the promised land of heaven.

The faith and scriptures are so rich and packed with meaning that we need time for it to sink in and time to spend jumping into it in a way that makes sense for us to joyfully live it out.

As you may have a little more time over Christmas, I would suggest that you give some time to your faith life by using FORMED. Go online and see all that is offered. If it has been a while, then all the more as more material has been added. There are new movies, talks and books that can help you grow in the faith. There are programs on scripture and on the saints that can help you connect the dots in living the faith in a way that draws others to Christ whether that is children or grandchildren, neighbors or co-workers.

Turn to the Holy Family and ask for their help in daily situations. Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, pray for us.
