

December 30, 2018 THE HOLY FAMILY IF JESUS, MARY AND JOSEPH

FROM OUR PASTOR:

As we celebrate the feast day of the Holy Family and consider our own, Fr. Francis Fernandez offers us some words for us to reflect on and look for ways to implement in our daily activities.

"Between Joseph and Mary there existed a holy affection, a spirit of service, and a mutual desire for each other's happiness. This is Jesus' family: sacred, holy, exemplary, a model of human virtues, ready to carry out God's will exactly. A Christian home must be an imitation of the house of Nazareth: a place where there is plenty of room for God so that He can be right at the center of the love that members of the family have for one another.

The family is a school of virtues and the ordinary place for us to find God. Husbands and wives will achieve this aim by exercising the virtues of faith and hope, facing serenely all the great and small problems which confront any family, and will be persevering in the love and enthusiasm with which they fulfill their duties. They will learn to smile and forget about themselves in order to pay attention to others. Husband and wife will listen to each other and to the children showing them that they are really loved and understood. They will forget about the unimportant little frictions that selfishness can magnify out of all proportion. They do lovingly all the small acts of service that make up their daily life together."

Does that sound too easy or unrealistic? As we look to our own families perhaps we look to the faults that we see or recall too readily the past where they or we have failed and fallen short. This feast places before us the model of the Holy Family, which was filled with grace. God's grace is so readily available to us through the sacraments and prayer. Are they a part of our lives? Are they nourishing our relationships in the family and with God.

This a feast that many wonder "what do we do?" We are not perfect or like Mary, Joseph and Jesus. Yet isn't that what we are striving for? Perhaps that may be the problem. We figure "look at them, how can we compete?" But it is not a competition. They are there for us. They want us to become more like them.

The death threat of Herod and fleeing into Egypt was not a great start to family life. Having angels direct you in ways you did not plan and leaving everything behind is very difficult. The fact that Mary did not sin or Joseph had such recourse to God's grace through Jesus should encourage us. We are called to live lives of holiness, built up by the sacraments and supported by the Word of God. The "perfect" holy family went through some great trials. So if we look at our imperfect families, we can not be surprised that things may be difficult for us, but with God nothing is impossible. So celebrate this feast day, your feast day, by making room for God and the good He has in store for you.
