After months of heroic struggle against the illness, he succumbed to pneumonia on Aug. 14, 1890, two days past his 38th birthday. By-Laws to change

At our upcoming Council meeting on October 20th (6:30pm Officers meet, business meeting at 7pm) we will be reviewing and voting on changes to our council bylaws. Those with email were sent three documents. The first email included the proposed bylaws along with the parameters proposed to be part of the new bylaws. In a subsequent email the original bylaws passed in the spring of 1937 were included for members to review and compare. Most of the possible changes don't warrant discussion, but some are worth mentioning here.

Here are the changes we will review: Annual dues, relief fund and amount, and the Financial Secretary compensation.

Annual Dues

The annual dues as they stand right now, with certain optional assessments, are \$29.15. Supreme charges \$30 for an online member to join though right now through the end of the year, membership is free. I've proposed in the bylaws we simply have the same amount for annual dues. There are about 4 different amounts our council bills depending on a member's longevity with the Knights and choices they make on optional assessments. Our Financial Secretary Randy Boehm keeps track of all this. Personally and why I am proposing a simple \$30 amount in the

bylaws is to simplify. There are two exceptions to the \$30 which have to do with the longevity and age of the

member. An Honorary member is one who has had 25

years or more of continuous membership and is less than 70 years old. They are normally assessed a smaller dues amount. Though not mentioned in the revised bylaws (it was present in the original bylaws), I proposed this amount to be \$20—which is the current amount of their dues). The Honorary Life member is one who has 25 or more years of continuous membership and is at least 70 years old; or is a 50 year member and at least 65 years old.

There are two levels of the Knights that assess per capita—Supreme and State. Our dues cover these assessments. I would suggest that any voluntary assessments, for example the PKD, a pennyper knight per day, be handled outside of dues and be a council decision, not an individual decision. I will cover this at the upcoming council meeting before we vote on the bylaws.

Relief Fund

The relief fund's purpose is simple and the new bylaws describe the initial funding of \$100 (to which additional amounts could be added upon voting by the council). This fund is designed to help members who may have a small financial need such as, most commonly, to pay the dues of a member who needs that help. In principle, not being able to pay dues should never be a reason for someone to leave the knights. The decision to assist a member lies with the Grand Knight, Financial Secretary and Treasurer.

Financial Secretary Compensation

The original bylaws specified that the Financial Secretary be compensated \$100/year. At least in recent years this has never been paid. In the revised bylaws Supreme requires this be a percent of dues collected (probably as an incentive for the FS to collect the dues—though not sure this a big factor). The council can chose an amount of 8 to 10 percent. We are proposing 8%. The FS can choose to receive the monies or not.

ADORATION

There are two opportunities weekly for members to participate in Adoration, one sponsored by the parish, the other by our council. Each Friday from 3-4pm We have adoration and Benediction in the Church. On First Fridays beginning in November there is Adoration at church from noon to 6pm. Our council will have a designated hour. The other Adoration is one at St. Theresa Chapel in

Union Center. Our council has taken two hours from 10pm to midnight on Fridays. If you would like to be on a rotation schedule contact Steve Hesprich
