

In the domestic church (the faith lives of our immediate families) we need stronger Catholic Christian male leadership.





Patrick E. Kelly was officially installed as the 14th supreme knight of the Knights of Columbus at the conclusion of Mass June 11 at St. Mary’s Church in New Haven, Connecticut, the site of the establishment of the Knights of Columbus in 1882. The newly installed supreme knight led the faithful in attendance at his installation in the Litany of St. Joseph and prayed an act of consecration of his administration, to St. Joseph. The importance of St. Joseph and the Holy Family is reflected in one of the notable features of Patrick’s own family, He is father to a young family with his wife Vanessa and three daughters.


“This year [of St. Joseph] is providential for the Knights of Columbus because there are few things the world needs more right now than men in the mold of St. Joseph,” the supreme knight said. In particular, he said that

## The Compass of Life—a Life Lived

*Exerpts From Feerick Funeral Home Obituary, Shorewood*  
Timothy Lalor Curran passed away on April 27, 2021, while being held and loved by his wife Kathy of 53 years and his three sons Daniel, Nicholas and Brenda.



Tim was born in Mauston, Wis., on Nov. 10, 1941, to Frank and Lucille (Lalor) Curran, less than four weeks before the bombing of Pearl Harbor. He lived with his mother's family in Madison after his dad enlisted in the U.S. Navy and left for the Pacific Theater, and returned to Mauston in 1946.

Tim's professional career was that of a newsman. He started as a scribe for the Juneau County Chronicle and Mauston Star, where he enjoyed

reporting on the goings on around town, tipping beers with the likes of young politico Tommy Thompson and inserting inside jokes into the photo captions of the newspaper.

Tim joined the Knights of Columbus Solomon Juneau Council on October 1, 1965 and was a 55 year, 3rd degree member. Two years later he joined AP (Associated Press) and had a career that took him away from Mauston.

Funeral services will be held at St. Patrick's Church in Mauston, Wis., on Wednesday, June 30 at 11 a.m. Tim's cousin, the Rev. Monsignor Tom Baxter, will officiate. Visitation will be held starting at 9 a.m.

## Compass Minutes— May Meeting

The meeting began at 7 pm. After opening prayer and pledge the minutes of the March 16, 2021 meeting were approved as written (there was only a brief April meeting held so no minutes from that meeting except council approved \$1,000 be donated to the West Elementary Closet (\$400 from last year's State Charity Raffle and remainder, \$2050, from this year's Hunter's Raffle for total of \$2450, donated to the St. Patrick School science program). They were as previously emailed and shown in the May 2021 newsletter.



Chaplain's report: Fr. John was not in attendance as Confirmation of

high school students was the same time as our meeting. He asked for prayers for the Confirmandi and one was offered in place of his report.

Grand Knight Report: We don't have a meeting quorum so election of officers will be delayed till the June 15th Council meeting.

Communications presented – Culture of Life request From Pro-life Director Dan Miller was reviewed. There are two ultrasound initiatives in Wisconsin. This request will be reviewed at the June meeting for possible financial support by the council.

The Marshfield council sent a request for financial support for their "Christmas in July" charity to support the Child Life and Expressive Therapies at the Marshfield Children's Hospital. Will review again at June meeting.

KnightCast is the new monthly program for members of the Knights, that highlights current interest topics, provided the 4th Thursday of the month from 7-8pm. Members can sign up to get a link invitation to watch. (www.KofC.org/Knightcast).

Status of Star Council – we need two net new members. Both program and insurance requirements have been completed.

May council Newsletter was published previous week. The State Convention was held May 1st. Steve Hesprich and Randy Boehm were the council delegates. Steve was elected to be a Supreme Delegate for the State of Wisconsin. Supreme has cancelled the physical convention because of Covid but will be conducting a virtual convention similar to last year. All Wisconsin delegates will gather in a location in Wisconsin to participate on August 3rd/4th. We discussed a bit about how the Supreme Convention is normally conducted.

The results of this year's State Raffle was a gross of \$614,000, with proceeds of \$464,000. Our council should receive roughly \$1,700 for ticket sales of 700 tickets.

Treasurer's Report: We have \$3427 in the general fund; \$1327 in the Charity Fund. \$40 check for 5th Sunday Masses (three this year, plus Memorial Mass Nov 2nd). \$1770+\$680 checks totaling \$2450 was presented to St. Patrick School for their science program. \$1,000 went to West Side Elementary's Clothing Closet program.

Membership Report: We need two new members to reach Star Council.

Family Director Report: The Jerry & Marie Family is the Family of the Month for April.

Community Report: no report

Fourth Degree Report: no report

New business: Financial Secretary report. Discussed contacting those who have not yet paid 2021 dues of \$20.

Talked about doing the Tootsie Roll Drive this summer. We have about 6 cases of candy. Steve will discuss with Fr. John about a good weekend in late July/early August for distributing after Masses (hope by that time Covid will be behind us).

Discussed the idea of having council shirts. Steve Hesprich will contact Eagle Promotions to explore options and costs.

Good of the Order: Prayer intention for our Confirmandi.
