A new program of the Knights of Columbus Programov resources contern maternity hop

Pregnancy resources centers, maternity homes, and the women and babies they serve, need our support more than ever. Beginning July 1st of this year, the Knights of Columbus have instituted a new program motivated by the recent Supreme Court decision that returns decisions about life to the states: ASAP - Aid and Support After Pregnancy.

ASAP is a \$5 million campaign in the United States and Canada to support pregnancy resource centers (PRCs). To

encourage council support of maternity homes (MHs) our headquarters organization gives \$100 to centers that councils support with each \$500 donation, for a total of \$600. May our Founder,

Blessed Michael McGivney, whose first confirmed miracle involved the

healing of an unborn child, guide our efforts to love and serve life. Let's continue to show women and children in need that Knights and communities are there with ASAP.
