

Fr. Cruz has had a rapid journey to Knighthood in our Order. He came to the United States, his first time here, in July 2024 to serve our parish. He took over the pastorship of St. Patrick's September 4, 2024. Later in September he joined the Knights of Columbus at our monthly business meeting, Tuesday September 17, 2024.

Many do not realize how challenging it can be for anyone, and especially a priest, to come to the United



States for the first time. For example learning simple things for us, like driving on the opposite side of the road and car. In India, the cars travel in the opposite directions we do in the United States and the driver is on the right side of the front seat.

Fr. Cruz is from the Archdiocese of Madurai, the same diocese where Fr. Jey was from. Fr. Cruz has been a priest for five years. He is a young and energetic. He is very excited to be here with us. Every experience he has

through these first many months is new. He had his first experience of enjoying a pancake breakfast hosted by our council and the 8th grade class.

He does have some surprising experiences too. His associations with schools in India include one where basketball was very active. He learned skills there and recently participated in a seminarian/clergy versus others in a basketball competition hosted by the Diocese of La Crosse.

Fr. Cruz was ordained a priest on April 28, 2019. He was an associate pastor for

two years in two different parishes. He then served three years as Vice-Principal and teaching students in his diocesan school. He also was co-editor for the Archdiocese of Madurai, India diocesan monthly magazine. He has published three books about motivation and the life of Mother Mary and Joseph. His degree is in Literature and Education, with a Masters in psychology. He has been a resource for retreats, and seminars in various schools and colleges. On YouTube hs has some 3,000 followers of motivational videos and spiritual talks. You may or may not know he now does a weekly Facebook video for our parish. We had hoped to get our CPID check and proceeds from the Spring State Charities Raffle. Those checks were not yet ready. We hope to see those checks in October.

Treasurer's Report: after a reimbursement to Steve Hesprich for Ice Cream Social expenses of \$43.53. We had an ending general account balance of \$3,355.96; Charitable fund balance at BMO is \$2439.85, after a donation from Jeff Wojcik of \$250.

Membership Report: Fr. Cruz became a member of the Knights today at this meeting. Church drives were explained that include 2-3 minute pulpit talk at the end of Mass.

Next event is the "Life Chain" to be held Sunday October 6, 2024, from 2:30—4 pm. Meet inside the gate at the east end of the church property.

registration at the High School football field. We put in a bid to host the


State competition but haven't heard yet if we have been selected. We

Community Report: The next Pancake Breakfast is December 8th and will benefit and be served by the 7th grade class. \$896 was the gross proceeds of the November 10th breakfast. Updating/improving the sign on the north side of Mauston that promotes the Mass times at St. Pats would cost \$942. It would be a 4'x6' sign. Motion was approved to replace that sign, near the Harley Davidson on Hwy 58. Round Table: On Jan 23, 2025 6:30 pm there is a Round Table meeting at St. Mary's. March 9, 2025 is the next St. Mary's Pancake Breakfast. 4th Degree Report: Next assembly meeting is Dec 16th, a Christmas party at Pizones in Tomah.

District Deputy Report: We need everyone to help grow our membership—Save \$100 if we get a new member between Oct-Dec (we have one). Keep Christ in Christmas Contest with Kids making posters. Compass of Leadership—Virtues

One of the particularly significant advances I've seen in my 25+ active years as a Knight are the multimedia advances along with the technology of Supreme made available at the council level. When I joined, Member Management was a primitive application you put on a PC that worked only on the PC it was installed. It was slow, it was awkward, prone to errors. Now it's an integrated, web based application with many features to make the work of the Grand Knight and Financial Secretary much easier. Reporting is less burdensome, and the number of online video aids are varied and coming with increasing frequency. One that has just appeared in the past couple of months is their Leadership video series. While Member Management is for the Grand Knight, Financial Secretary, and to a lesser extent, the Membership Director, the various program aids are available to the general membership. Many of these can assist Knights not only in their Knights involvements, but in their life. I would go so far to say that they help men, and others, in their life in general and especially as they seek, or perhaps have thrust upon them, leadership: Leadership in the family, faith, community, and in work lives.

The title of the new series is "The Leadership Virtues Series". Its stated purpose is "become a Christ-centered leader as you discover the virtues of moral leadership, based on Jesus' example." The series has a 2-minute trailer and then 8 sessions of an average of roughly 9 minutes each with the shortest 6:20 minutes and the longest 13:25. The topics include:

- 1. The Rationale for a Christ-Centered Approach to Leadership
- 2. What is Moral Virtue?
- 3. Prayer—the First Habit
- 4. Passion and Leadership
- 5. Magnanimity and Leadership
- 6. The Paradox of Humble Leadership
- 7. Magnanimity and Taking a Stand
- 8. Humility and Emotional Intelligence

On Thursday, February 22, 1900, in honor of George Washington's birthday, the Knights of Columbus celebrated the first Patriotic Exemplification of the Fourth Degree; the visible arm of the Order. The degree was held in the Lennox Lyceum in New York City with 1,100

candidates in attendance. On Saturday, February 22, 2025, the Knights of Columbus will return to New York City to celebrate the 125th Anniversary of the Fourth Degree within the historic walls of America's parish church - Saint Patrick's Cathedral. We invite all members to begin planning for this historic event by encouraging 3rd degree members to join the patriotic degree in the 125th anniversary year. The new degree format that allows guests to attend is expected to be rolled



out at the New York City exemplification.

Two exemplifications are planned in Wisconsin this Spring, with details forthcoming. The first is Saturday April 12, 2025 in Green Bay. The second will take place Saturday May 3, 2025 in Rhinelander. It is unclear if these two exemplifications will be done with the new format, or use the current method. Either format is well worth experiencing. 2025 is a memorable time to join the 4th degree of patriotism.

On Sunday September 22, 2024 St. Mary's in Lyndon Station the parish celebrated the 125th Jubilee of the building of the current church. Bishop Gerard Battersby was the main celebrant.
