

Christ's Compass— Eucharistic Celebration

Thank you Brother Knights for inviting me to serve as your council Chaplain.

Do you know why Christians celebrate the Eucharist on Sundays? Didn't God rest on the last day of the week? Sunday is actually deemed to be the first day of the week, not the last; Sunday is the day that God began creation we are told in the Genesis story. The Spirit of God moved on the waters on the first day! For the Jews Spirit is a feminine gender word which also means breath or wind. Like God, Jews rested on the seventh day, Saturday, and early Christians, too, used to go to synagogues on Saturdays.

With the advent of Pentecost, however, which is 50 days after Easter, itself a Sunday, the church has traditionally also celebrated not only its birth day, but the weekly Lord's Day on a Sunday. We celebrate Eucharist on Sunday, then as a reminder of the first creation and of the second creation. The Holy Spirit that stirred the waters of creation returned to us on Pentecost making a new creation, her church, and making us new creatures because of the Resurrection. This is really what we are all about today. And every Sunday! So, happy birthday!

Although Pentecost is the reminder of starting something new, it is also an ending. On Pentecost we end the Easter season. The Easter candle which has been burning since Easter to remind us of the light that has come into the world, will be set aside and used only if there is a baptism. The following week we celebrate Trinity Sunday and then continue what is called "Ordinary Time' which simply means that the joyous feasts have ended, and we go back to the Gospel of Luke and continue to read the story of Jesus, focusing primarily on his teachings and parables.




the percentage amounts we have designated. For a number of years now, 90% goes to the Mauston High School special needs program. 10% goes to our St. Patrick parish school.

mother. Grand Knight Report: Thank you notes received from the Mauston HS FFA for use of the pancake griddle and from Mauston HS IDS for the classroom donation. Next council meeting is April 15, 2025 at 7:00 PM. Reminder regarding annual membership dues. Treasurer's Report: The general fund had a beginning balance of \$4869.90 and deposits from St. Pat's breakfast for \$777.00; dues received \$654.35; St. Mary's breakfast for \$555.00; with an ending balance on \$6856.25. On Treasurer's report are the liabilities from the breakfasts so our true available balance in the general fund is \$2124.74. We'll have some expenses towards breakfasts, that's hopefully next month, and we can have the total amount available for Saint Pat's School. The other balance sheet is the Charitable fund held at BMO with an ending balance of \$2821.59; no expenses nor deposits there. GK: Thank you for the financial report. Fr Cruz: Very short and sweet about financial report, tomorrow, I have financial meeting that takes with more than one hour. From the previous financial statement, the general fund reflected an ending balance of \$6,918.58; however, this amount did not include the Council check payment of \$317.00 for State per Capita. So, the actual balance last month would be 6,601.58. And then no expenses or checks for the month of May so our ending balance is \$6,601.58. Then we have the breakfast expense amount from Brother Brett Kudick of \$625.49 that we're going to reduce our breakfast intake. We applied that amount between Lyndon and Mauston. So, the St. Pat's total after expenses will be \$2,461.74. Divide that by four for the four classes. And then we'll reduce the Lyndon Station amount by \$231.43 for expenses. Received an inquiry from Fr. Cryton at St. Mary's to cover the parish expense for the purchase of The Word Among Us subscription in the amount of \$707.28. When looking at the proceeds from the pancake breakfasts at St. Mary's in the amount of \$722.00, which would cover the associated subscription cost.
