Happy March! I hope that February has been kind to all of you. It has been a beautiful February here at St. Patricks. There were many great things that happened and we are underway in our Lenten journey.

We started the month finishing up Catholic Schools Week. It was so much fun to participate in all of the activities and see the joy on the children's faces each day! Wrapping up with Trivia was like a mini Brains Competition. If you are not familiar with "Brains" it is a diocesan wide trivia in areas of science, geography, english, religion, math, and general knowledge. The students compete with schools from around the diocese and this year, our team took 4th place. We are so proud of their hard work and effort put into studying. They work in the classroom, with each other, and some even took the time to study at home! Our diocese is blessed with 63 schools, St. Patrick's Mauston included, and nearly 7,000 students; it is truly a special recognition to be part of the Brains competition! Not only did we take 4th place but there is a prize that is given to 1 team that day and it is announced by the bishop at mass...The Sportsmanship Award. This year, St. Patrick's team was the recipient of this award! What an honor for our school, the middle school participants, and Mrs. Whitney.

This year, we had two special days rolled into one. Ash Wednesday, the start of Lent, and Valentines Day. We celebrate Lent by making sacrifices. There are many things that we can do or sacrifice throughout the season. This year, we are doing 40,000 push ups—collectively—throughout the 40 days of Lent. This challenge has been accepted by all classrooms and they are working hard to fill up the jug with beans as they see their progress measured. Classrooms also discuss the power of prayer and fasting appropriate for their age group. It is important to keep in mind the power of prayer and fasting that Christ has shared with us. These examples are things that will stick with students for the rest of their lives.

We wrapped up Pancake Breakfasts for the year as well! Our final breakfast is in February hosted by 5th grade. We are so thankful for the support from the Knights of Columbus. This simple fundraiser helps support extra curricular activities for our 5-8th grade students. The students are part of serving and the Knights share the proceeds. It is a great way to teach service and the value of work.

Dear Parents, Teachers and Students,




We are almost in the middle of our Lenten season 2024. So, some thoughts for Lent. If we give ourselves fully to prayer and reflection, the days of Lent provide a wonderful opportunity to discover God's will. Explore how to listen for God's voice through *Living Lent Daily*. Spend time each day developing your spiritual intuition and taking steps to discern God's will for you. What do we do when we're facing an upcoming big event, celebration, or special occasion in our lives? We prepare for it.

Holy week and Easter are "big events" in the liturgical year of the Church and in the spiritual life of a Christian. So, as Christians, we prepare spiritually for these through the forty days of Lent. This means that, during Lent, we rededicate ourselves to prayer. There are as many ways to pray, but a few prayer methods can help us in particular to spiritually prepare ourselves during Lent:

- 1. Make your abstinence a prayer-in-action.
- 2. Renew yourself through personal reflective prayer.
- 3. Pray the Stations of the Cross.
- 4. Meditate on Holy Scripture in the presence of the Most Blessed Sacrament.
- 5. Reflect deeper by attending everyday Mass during Lent.
- 6. Join or start a prayer group.
- 7. Pray with children or as a family.
- 8. Start a practice of daily prayer that will last after Lent.
