Saving pull tabs is easy! They're compact with a high concentration of recyclable aluminum. Did you know there is more aluminum in the tab than there is in the entire can? Revenue from recycling these little bits of aluminum helps keep families close to their children who are undergoing medical treatment.

How you can help:

Spread the word to your family, friends, classmates and co-workers to start collecting their pop tabs! There is a drop off container located in the school lobby to place your Ziploc bag of tabs, which will then be delivered to a local participating McDonald's Restaurant.

Get Creative!

Have fun designing a collection cup or box or jug to keep the tabs in at home and work! Then when you have a full collection, put in a Ziploc bag and deliver to St. Patrick's School. We'll handle the rest! Thank you for participating and what a great way to "Pull Together" and support families in need. In 2016 Ms. Randall's cousin and pen pal lost his fight with cancer. He was only 9 years old. "Braden was a fighter, an inspiration and friend." said Sophie's mother, Kerry, when asked why Sophie and her family decided to begin collecting pull tabs for the Ronald McDonald House. "During his long fight Braden's family was able to stay at the Ronald McDonald House while he was receiving treatments. His family now coordinates a pull tab program at their school in Minnesota, so we thought this would be a great way to show our support, with such an easy way to make a positive impact."

For those of you who don't know the Ronald McDonald House Programs are a home away from home that provide comfort, support and resources to families who travel far from home for the medical care their child needs.
