



## A Message from Father Cruz

My dear Students, Staff and Parents in Christ Jesus;

Everyone in this world expects some miracles in life. Even as a student of this age some time that expect miracles when they face some problems. What really is a miracle? Let me explain in a short story.



Little Johnny was in Sunday school and his mother came to collect him. "Boy," exclaimed Johnny as he settled himself in the car, "that story of Moses and all those people crossing the Red Sea was something!" "Tell me all about it," said his mother.
