What are the four marks of the Church? The marks of the Church are the four essential features of the Church and her mission: We believe that the Church is one, holy, catholic, and apostolic. References: Scripture: Matthew 28:19; John 17:20-21; Ephesians 2:19-20, 4:1-6, 5:25-27 CCC: nos. 811-12

How should we prepare to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion? We recall who it is we are receiving and approach the sacrament with great reverence and awe, which should be reflected in our demeanor and clothing. If we are in a state of mortal sin, we should repent of our sin and receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before going to Communion. The Church also requires us to fast for at least one hour from all foods and liquids, except for water and medicine, before receiving Holy Communion. SAINTS FUN FACTS

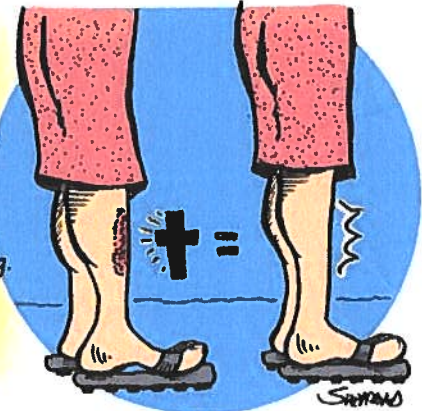

St. Peregrine is the patron saint of cancer victims.

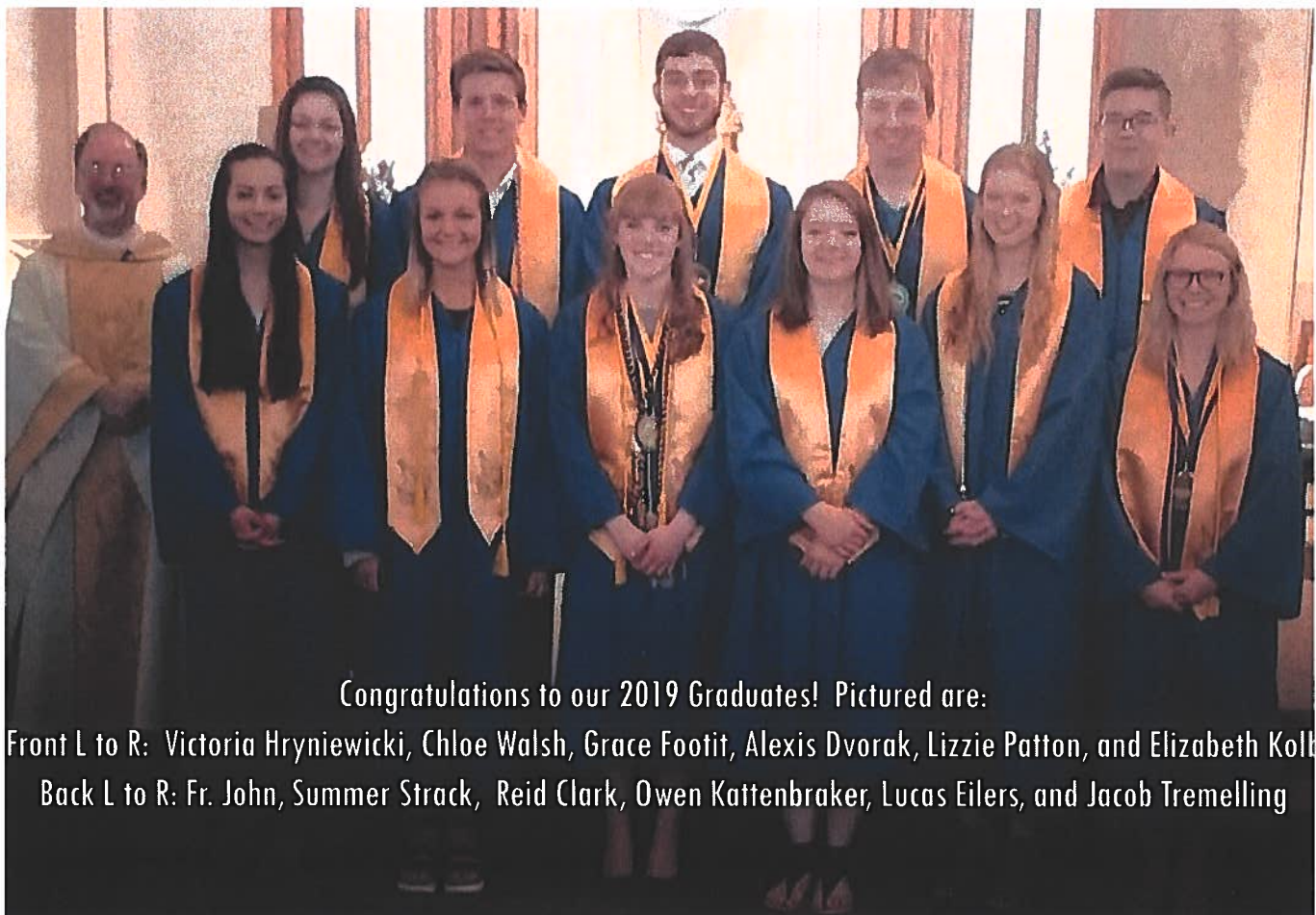
Later in life, Peregrine was afflicted with cancer in his leg.
