“When is this quarantine going to be over?” “When are we going to be done with all of this!” These are the questions that I get asked over and over from my children, along with, “When is the corona virus going to be gone?” Well I would love to be able to answer, “Now!” and have things go back to “normal”, but I know that it is not going to be that easy. Another question that I have received a lot is, “When can we celebrate Mass again?” Well one important thing to note is that Father has always been celebrating the Mass, he has just been celebrating it privately. The private celebrations for the daily Mass will continue for the time being. What we have just recently received were our guidelines from the Bishop on what needs to happen in order for us to be able to celebrate the Mass publicly. We have 53 guide lines that have been laid out and we spent a lengthy meeting 😊 with members of Sacred Worship and Parish Council, discussing how that might look in our Parish, but the most important piece that is missing in all of this is **volunteers**. Father talked about it in his homily this past week, and we have posted the guidelines on our Parish Facebook page, and also our Parish website, but what we are looking for are Volunteers! We need YOU who are under the age of 65. These volunteers will assist with greeting and making sure that we are within our 25% capacity, guiding people to the pews, helping with the dismissal of Mass, and the cleaning and sanitizing of the church after Mass. In this role, you MUST wear a mask and also watch and sign off on the Diocesan Training. So please don't overwhelm yourself with the what – ifs and the preparation just start with are you under the age of 65. . . if the answer is yes then ask the Holy Spirit. . . Are you calling me to do your work here? If the answer is yes then contact the Rectory and Father will get you set up with the work that needs to happen. If the answer is no, then ask the Holy Spirit to guide you to where it is that you are to do his work, and start there.
