We have our Saint Patrick's Day dinner on the 8th of March that all are invited to attend from 11am-1pm in Reardon Hall. Our <u>Holy Happy Hours</u> are the last Tuesdays of the month at State Street Tap from 6:30pm-7:30pm. This is also an opportunity to gather and socialize for 30 minutes and then the last 30 minutes are discussing the topic of the evening. These topics have ranged from Forgiveness to Euthanasia and have provided much to think about long after the evening has ended. And lastly maybe you would like to engage in Parish life by serving with your hands...the PCCW ladies are planning on cleaning the church April 6th at 9am and all that is needed is a willingness to clean, they will help direct you with the rest. Another way is maybe you would like to help with decorating the church for Easter. Following the Good Friday Service on April 10th there will be a group that will be decorating, so feel free to stay after and help!
