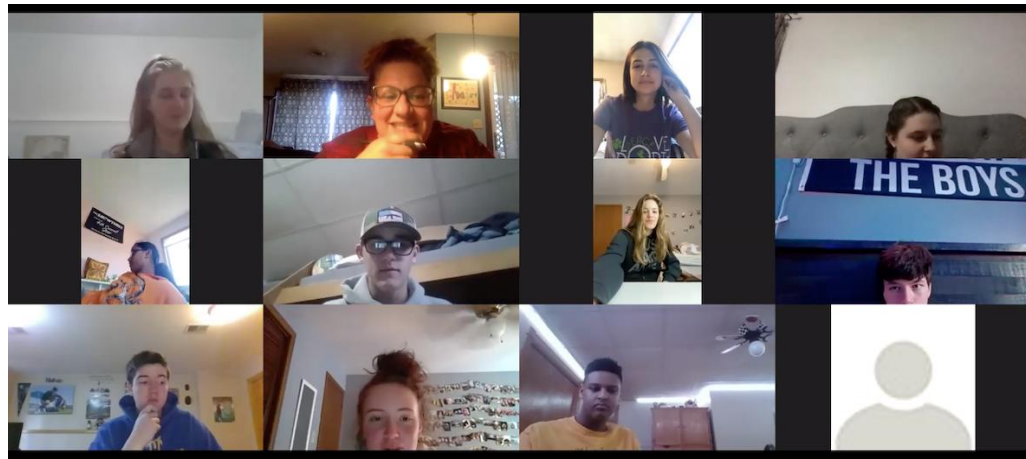
## ZOOM

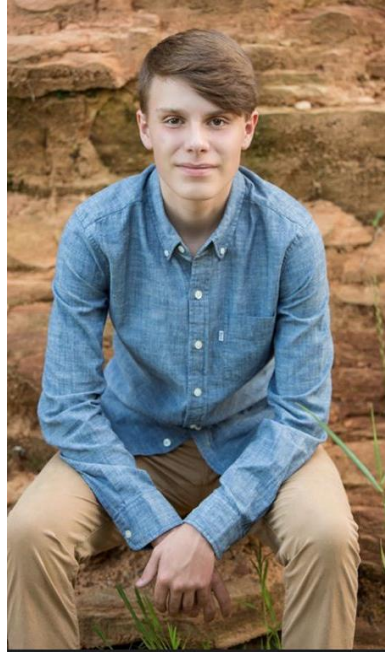
