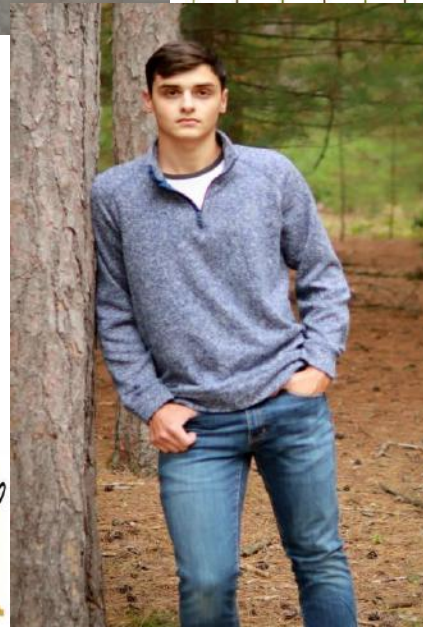

An Italian teenager who used the internet to spread his faith is on a path to becoming the Catholic Church's first millennial saint. Carlo Acutis, who died of leukaemia in 2006 aged 15, has already been dubbed "the patron saint of the internet". He was beatified on October 10th, 2020 in Assisi and on October 12th, 2020 the Church celebrated his feast for the first time. What put him on the path to Sainthood was the way he lived out his short time on this Earth: He had an advanced awareness of the meaning of life and how to live well. "To be always united to Jesus is my program of life," he declared. He lived life with a certain urgency: "Every minute that passes," he said, "is one minute less to become like God." Blessed Carlo had an ardent love for Jesus in the Eucharist. He attended daily Mass from the time he was 7 and spent time each day in adoration. "The more Eucharist we receive," he believed, "the more we will become like Jesus." He had a Eucharistic amazement. It didn't make sense to him that there would be huge crowds for soccer games and rock concerts but no lines before the tabernacle where God is present and lives among us.
