#### Did you know?

We begin each November with the feasts of All Saints and All Souls, and the entire month is dedicated to remembering (and praying for!) the dead. If we do not remember death, then we won't remember to pray for those who have died. And those who have died desperately need our prayers. That is why we often refer to the souls in Purgatory as the Poor Souls. So what is Purgatory? "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1030). Traditionally, we liken Purgatory to a purifying fire. How can we help the Poor Souls in **Purgatory?** There are many ways, all of which involve prayer and sacrifice. A few are: First, we can offer Holy Mass for them. Another way in addition to praying at Mass and offering up one's communion, you can also have Masses said for the Poor Souls. Contact your parish church to have this done. Another way is to have your family pray the
